Pupil Premium Grant

Hutton Rudby Primary School

All schools are allocated funding for children who are eligible for free school meals, looked-after children (children in public care) and those families with parents in the Armed Forces.

The targeted use of pupil premium supports Hutton Rudby Primary to ensure each child gets valuable learning experiences according to their needs. Governors and the management team in school consider a range of additional support. This includes such measures as

- Specialist teachers ensuring the best possible quality first learning experiences in the classroom.
- Wider educational opportunities, that engage, motivate and challenge pupils so that they gain wider experiences, resilience, skills and stamina in which to take their place in the world.
- One to one and small group work with teaching assistants trained in particular areas for example phonics, reading or interaction and communication. This supports identified needs and overcomes gaps in learning
- Use of specialist tailored IT programmes

The Pupil Premium Grant (PPG) allocation for 2016/17 is £7,780

To be spent on:

- Quality first teaching
- Specific interventions targeted on need e.g. circle of friends, success in arithmetic, family advocacy, phonics count
- Specialist teaching assistants
- Wider educational opportunities including residential visits and enrichment trips
- Access to clubs
- Spelling, grammar and comprehension support

The Pupil Premium Grant (PPG) allocation for 2015/16 was £9,021

This was spent on:

- Quality first teaching
- Specific interventions targeted on need e.g. circle of friends, success in arithmetic, family advocacy, phonics count
- Specialist teaching assistants
- Wider educational opportunities including residential visits and enrichment trips
- Access to clubs
- Spelling, grammar and comprehension support

Pupil premium children made good progress and were supported to meet their targets.

The Pupil Premium Grant (PPG) allocation for 2014/15 was £6,100

Pupil Premium was used to support:

- Quality first teaching
- Intervention programmes for specific children e.g. Family Advocacy, Success @ Arithmetic
- Specialist teachers
- Wider educational opportunities including Residential Outdoor visits
- Access to school clubs e.g.; art, multiskills
- Resources to support mathematics and reading

Pupil premium children made good progress in 2014-15 and were supported to meet their targets.

The Pupil Premium Grant (PPG) allocation for 2013/14 was £4,712

These monies were spent on intervention programmes, small group teaching and enrichment activities including school trips and residential visits.

- Outdoor adventurous activities and forest schools workshops
- Resources to support reading
- Resources and training to support mathematics
- Success at Arithmetic and base ten materials
